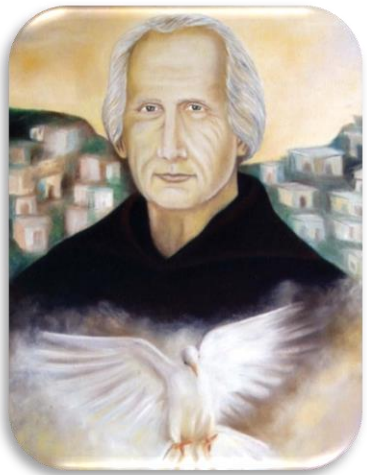


Charism

Carmelite Barefoot of the Roman Province was born in Carpeneto (AL), Italy on July 8, 1696. He made his Solemn Profession on

September 9, 1723. In the year of 1737, led by the ardent love of Carmelite spirituality, founded the Congregation in Italy, inserting it in the current of the active and popular

apostolate of his time.

He had drawn from the burning heart of the Holy Mother Teresa the idea of expanding the Reformation to other souls who would dedicate themselves to the Human and Christian Promotion of Youth, especially of Adolescent Women.

Carmelite Teresian Sisters

Desiring to expand their charism, on October 25, 1979, four Italian sisters went to serve as missionaries to Brazil; two Italian sisters along with two Indian sisters to India on March 4, 1992, especially in the Christian education of children and young people. Faithful to the Teresian spirit, we consider as an integral part of our Charism the primacy of the apostolic fruitfulness of the contemplative life itself.

Saint Teresa of Jesus

Of Los Andes

(Santiago de Chile, July 13, 1900 - April 12, 1920) was a Chilean Carmelite nun.

Her baptismal name was Juana Fernandez Solar. From her adolescence she lived

fascinated by the figure of Jesus. She

entered the monastery of the Discalced Carmelites of "Los Andes", on May 7, 1919,

under the name Teresa de Jesus. She died at

the age of nineteen, after having made a

religious profession before completing the

novitiate, in view of the danger of death.

She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on

April 3, 1987, in Santiago, Chile. She was

canonized by the same Pope John Paul II, in the Basilica of St. Peter, on March 21, 1993,

and proposed by him as a model for youth.

She is the first flower of holiness of the

Chilean nation and the Carmel of Latin

America.
